

# Great Lakes Bay Veterans Coalition hosts successful Personal Hygiene Drive



The Great Lakes Bay Veterans Coalition hosts an annual Personal Hygiene Drive to support the Aleda E Lutz VA Hospital in Saginaw. This event is held during the entire month of November with delivery usually the second Friday in December.

The hospital has a program where they help homeless and low-income veterans by giving them personal hygiene items. Each veteran can receive about a dozen items. The program is run by volunteers and isn't funded by federal dollars. The group was asking for donations each month to meet the need.

Three years ago, the Coalition decided to collect some items and took down two

truckloads of supplies. That kept the group supplied for about four months. The next year, the Coalition provided enough supplies to keep them stocked till October. Last year, not only did they have enough supplies for the year, they were able to send boxes of supplies to their CBOCs (Community Based Outreach Clinics) all over mid-Michigan.

This is only possible thanks to the efforts of groups like DTE who make a huge impact on the success of the program.

#### **Barton Malow Construction Corner**

In February, with the majority of the project being completed, there will be small amounts of traffic driving to the turbines for in-tower work throughout the month. We still advise for the safety of the public to watch work activities from a distance.

Collection line crews will be wrapping up work in the first half of February in Jonesfield. Splice pits and junction box installation will occur on the collection line routes as necessary in the field. The remaining work will occur near or in the turbines.

Finally, restoration crews have been stopped due to the weather and will be returning to work in the spring when the weather allows. The final stone cap will be placed on the access road in the spring as well. The transmission line is planning to continue access road removal in Richland and Jonesfield townships.
