### **Barton Malow Construction Corner**

During the month October, the project team will be focused on the assembly portion of the wind turbines in Jonesfield Township. The large crawler cranes will continue moving around the project site, so please be cautious for road closures in the area. During turbine assembly, we ask that for your safety and the safety of our crews, you observe the process from the county roads to keep a safe distance.

Collection line crews will also be working throughout the project footprint installing the underground cable that connects the towers together throughout the month of October.

With hunting season underway, we will continue working in the area. Please be mindful of the workers on your parcels completing turbine assembly, site restoration, and collection line installation.
